

## Descendants of Richard Patrick of Buriton

### *Generation One*

1. Richard<sup>1</sup> PATRICK; born circa 1487.<sup>1</sup>

Richard Patrick arrived in the parish of Buriton circa 1499 at age 12 and became the richest taxpayer by 1524/25.<sup>2</sup>

Children of Richard<sup>1</sup> Patrick and an unknown spouse were:

2. i. Ralph<sup>2</sup> Patrick, married Agnes (--?--); married Phyllis (--?--).

### *Generation Two*

2. Ralph<sup>2</sup> PATRICK;<sup>3</sup> married Agnes (--?--); married Phyllis (--?--);<sup>4,5</sup> died 1584 at Buriton, Co. Hampshire, England.<sup>6,7</sup>

Ralph Patrick was a yeoman leasing 30 acres from Mapledurham Manor in 1550, 1569 and 1576.<sup>8,9</sup> He left a will in Jul 1582 at Buriton, Co. Hampshire, England; where he mentioned his wife Phyllis and children Lawrence and Wenyfre.<sup>5,4</sup>

Children of Ralph<sup>2</sup> Patrick and Agnes (--?--) were as follows:

3. i. Lawrence<sup>3</sup> Patrick  
ii. Wenyfre Patrick.<sup>5,4,5,4</sup>  
iii. Elizabeth Patrick;<sup>10,11,10,11</sup> married Richard Cowrey.<sup>11</sup>
4. iv. Margery Patrick, married Thomas Casson.

There were no children of Ralph<sup>2</sup> Patrick and Phyllis (--?--).

### *Generation Three*

3. Lawrence<sup>3</sup> PATRICK;<sup>12,13</sup> died before 1665.<sup>14</sup>

Lawrence appointed a collector of Picage & Stallage for Thomas Hanbury, in Petersfield 1597.<sup>15</sup> Lawrence Patrick was recorded in Buriton several times between 1593-1619.<sup>16</sup> Lawrence Patrick was living in Buriton in 1629.<sup>17</sup>

Children of Lawrence<sup>3</sup> Patrick and an unknown spouse were as follows:

5. i. Thomas<sup>4</sup> Patrick, married Elianor (--?--).  
ii. Ralph Patrick<sup>18</sup> was living in 1614.<sup>18</sup>

*Generation Four*

5. Thomas<sup>4</sup> PATRICK;<sup>22</sup> married Elianor (--?--); died 1672.<sup>23</sup>

He left a will on 20 Oct 1669 at Buriton, Co. Hampshire, England; where he stated "I give unto my daughter Frances now the wife of John Searle.../ I give unto my daughter Elianor the wife of William Tipper.../ I give unto my daughter Bridgett the wife of Richard Logsflesh (Hogsflesh?).../ Whereas I am possessed of a howse garden & some lands thereunto belonginge lyinge in Buriton...I give...unto my said lovinge wife Elianor. And after the decease of my said loveing wife...onely unto my sonne Lawrence Patricke to have."<sup>24</sup> An inventory of Thomas' estate was made 22 Sep 1671 (Latin).<sup>25</sup>

Elianor (--?--) died in 1683.<sup>26</sup> She was buried on 15 Sep 1683 at St. Mary's Church, Buriton, Co. Hampshire, England, "a widow."<sup>26</sup>

Children of Thomas<sup>4</sup> Patrick and Elianor (--?--) were as follows:

6. Lawrence<sup>5</sup> PATRICK;<sup>28,29</sup> married Jane (--?--);<sup>30</sup> died 3 Jun 1709 at Buriton, Co. Hampshire, England;<sup>31</sup> buried 24 Jun 1709 at St. Mary's Church, Buriton, Co. Hampshire, England;<sup>32</sup> his estate was probated 22 Jul 1709 at Co. Hampshire, England; where an inventory of goods was made. The estate was valued at £46/2/6 and son Thomas was mentioned.<sup>33</sup>

Jane (--?--) died in 1705.<sup>34</sup> She was buried on 19 Oct 1705 at St. Mary's Church, Buriton, Co. Hampshire, England.<sup>34</sup>

Children of Lawrence<sup>5</sup> Patrick and Jane (--?--) were as follows:

7. Richard<sup>6</sup> PATRICK;<sup>35,36</sup> born before 1705;<sup>37</sup> married Anne Luff possibly 1 Oct 1721 at All Saints, Chichester, Co. Sussex, England;<sup>38</sup> married Elizabeth Wise 9 Oct 1735 at St. Mary's Church, Buriton, Co. Hampshire, England;<sup>30,39</sup> died 1742;<sup>40</sup> buried 21 Apr 1742 at St. Mary's Church, Buriton, Co. Hampshire, England.<sup>40</sup>

Anne LUFF was born circa 1701.<sup>41</sup> She died "in the 27th year of her age" on 7 Oct 1727.<sup>42</sup> She was buried on 19 Oct 1727 at St. Mary's Church, Buriton, Co. Hampshire, England.<sup>43</sup> Ann's surname may not be Luff.<sup>44</sup>

Children of Richard<sup>6</sup> Patrick and Anne Luff both born at Buriton, Co. Hampshire, England, were as follows:

- i. Elizabeth<sup>7</sup> Patrick; christened 5 Aug 1722;<sup>45</sup> died Feb 1723;<sup>46</sup> buried 4 Feb 1723 at St. Mary's Church, Buriton, Co. Hampshire, England, "daughter of Richard and Anne Patrick."<sup>43</sup>
10. ii. Richard Patrick, christened 12 Jan 1723/24; married Ann (--?--).

Elizabeth WISE may have been buried on 25 Nov 1770 at St. Mary's Church, Buriton, Co. Hampshire, England, "Widow Patrick of Petersfield."<sup>47</sup> Elizabeth (as widow) with son Thomas, Frances Wise and his wife Mary were settled by Petersfield Parish in 1745.<sup>48</sup>

Children of Richard<sup>6</sup> Patrick and Elizabeth Wise were:

- i. Thomas<sup>7</sup> Patrick;<sup>49,49</sup> baptized 20 Jan 1736/37 at St. Mary's Church, Buriton, Co. Hampshire, England.<sup>49</sup>

Elizabeth (as widow) with son Thomas, Frances Wise and his wife Mary were settled by Petersfield Parish in 1745.<sup>48</sup>

8. Lawrence<sup>6</sup> PATRICK; married Jane Grace 19 May 1707 at St. Mary's Church, Buriton, Co. Hampshire, England;<sup>50,51</sup> married Susannah Lovell 8 Nov 1732 at Cathedral Church of the Holy Trinity, Winchester, Co. Hampshire, England;<sup>30,52</sup> died 1736 at Nursted, Buriton, Co. Hampshire, England;<sup>53,47</sup> buried 13 Nov 1736 at St. Mary's Church, Buriton, Co. Hampshire, England;<sup>47</sup> his estate was probated 14 Jan 1736/37 at Nursted, Buriton, Co. Hampshire, England; where it was stated "yeoman deceased... appraised 14th day of Januray 1736... £36/18/-... was granted...unto Susanna Patrick widow and relict."<sup>54</sup>

Jane GRACE died in 1730.<sup>47</sup> She was buried on 16 Sep 1730 at St. Mary's Church, Buriton, Co. Hampshire, England, "wife of Laurence Patrick."<sup>47</sup> She could possibly be read as Jane Grew.<sup>55</sup>

There were no children of Lawrence<sup>6</sup> Patrick and Jane Grace.

Susannah LOVELL died in 1749.<sup>47</sup> She was buried on 13 Apr 1749 at St. Mary's Church, Buriton, Co. Hampshire, England.<sup>47</sup>

Children of Lawrence<sup>6</sup> Patrick and Susannah Lovell were:

- i. Lawrence<sup>7</sup> Patrick;<sup>49,49</sup> baptized 24 Sep 1733 at St. Mary's Church, Buriton, Co. Hampshire, England;<sup>49</sup> died 1745;<sup>47</sup> buried 12 Nov 1745 at St. Mary's Church, Buriton, Co. Hampshire, England, "son of widow Patrick."<sup>47</sup>

9. Thomas<sup>6</sup> PATRICK; married Elizabeth Searle 17 Apr 1707 at St. Mary's Church, Buriton, Co. Hampshire, England;<sup>51,39</sup> died 1751;<sup>47</sup> buried 17 May 1751 at St. Mary's Church, Buriton, Co. Hampshire, England;<sup>47</sup> his estate was probated 24 Aug 1751 at Buriton, Co. Hampshire, England.<sup>56</sup>

He left a will on 11 Oct 1750 at Buriton, Co. Hampshire, England; where he stated "give and devise... my Farm Lands and Premises... in the Tything of Sheet in the Parish of Petersfield unto my son Thomas Patrick and Sarah his wife... and after their decease Then I give and devise the said Farm Lands unto my grandson Thomas Patrick... Also I give... my Lands called East Field the three Bindens the Crondal Crouch and two Bows containing... Thirty Acres...lying and being in Buriton aforesaid and now in the tenure or occupation of my son William Patrick) unto my said son Thomas Patrick. Also I give... my Farm Lands and premises...in the Tything of Weston in the Parish of Buriton called...Cotterills, Rake Field and Holloway Mead unto my son William Patrick...and after his decease Then I give...the said Farm Lands...unto the Male Heirs of my said son William Patrick... Also I give and bequeath unto my daughter Elizabeth the Wife of John West the sum of Five Pounds and to my grandsons Thomas and John West the sum of Ten Pounds apiece to be paid them at their several and respective Ages of one and twenty years and to all the daughters of the said Elizabeth West that shall arrive and attain the ages of one and twenty years the sum of Ten Pounds apiece... Also I give...the tenement that I hold by Lease under the Church, called...East Leigh...unto my kinsman Richard Patrick...if he the said Richard Patrick...shall well and truly pay...his Brother Thomas Patrick the sum of Fifteen Pounds... Also I give...all the rest and residue...unto my said son William Patrick... Also I give...unto my said Wife Elizabeth Patrick the use and useage of all my Household Goods and Furniture... In witness whereof I the said Thomas Patrick to this my last Will and testament contained in the two Sheets of Paper have hereunto sett my Hand and Seal this Eleventh day of October in the twenty fourth year of the reign of our Sovereign Lord George the second by the Grace of God of Great Britain France and Ireland King Defender of the Faith and so forth and in the year of our Lord 1750."<sup>56</sup>

Elizabeth SEARLE died in 1762.<sup>47</sup> She was buried on 10 Aug 1762 at St. Mary's Church, Buriton, Co. Hampshire, England, "Elizabeth of Thomas Patrick of Lynch."<sup>47</sup>

Children of Thomas<sup>6</sup> Patrick and Elizabeth Searle all born at St. Mary's Church, Buriton, Co. Hampshire, England, were as follows:

11. i. Elizabeth<sup>7</sup> Patrick, baptized Feb 1707/8; married John West.
12. ii. Thomas Patrick of Lynch, baptized 30 May 1710; married Sarah (--?--).
13. iii. William Patrick, baptized 2 Sep 1712; married Mary Heberdan.

### *Generation Seven*

10. Richard<sup>7</sup> PATRICK;<sup>57,58</sup> christened 12 Jan 1723/24 at Buriton, Co. Hampshire, England;<sup>59</sup> married Ann (--?--) circa 1750;<sup>60</sup> died "aged 59" 10 Aug 1783 at Buriton, Co. Hampshire, England, at age 59;<sup>61</sup> buried 13 Aug 1783 at St. Mary's Church, Buriton, Co. Hampshire, England.<sup>43</sup>

He was living in 1778.<sup>62</sup> He was a victualer.<sup>63,64</sup> His estate was administered on 16 Aug 1783 "granted to Ann Patrick his widow."<sup>63</sup>

Ann (--?--) died in Aug 1790.<sup>65</sup> She was buried on 8 Aug 1790 at St. Mary's Church, Buriton, Co. Hampshire, England, "widow of Richard Patrick."<sup>43</sup> Her estate was administered on 16 Jul 1791 "granted ... to Richard Patrick ...her only son and next of kin ...amount in value ...100 pounds."<sup>66</sup>

Children of Richard<sup>7</sup> Patrick and Ann (--?--) all born at Buriton, Co. Hampshire, England, were as follows:

- i. Ann<sup>8</sup> Patrick; christened 7 Dec 1752;<sup>59</sup> married Richard Wyatt 29 Apr 1774 at St. Mary's Church, Buriton, Co. Hampshire, England;<sup>39</sup> died Feb 1830 at age 77;<sup>46</sup> buried 20 Feb 1830 at St. Mary's Church, Buriton, Co. Hampshire, England, "age 77."<sup>67</sup>
- ii. Elizabeth Patrick; christened 1 Jun 1755;<sup>59</sup> married Edward Long 20 Oct 1778 at St. Mary's Church, Buriton, Co. Hampshire, England.<sup>39</sup>
- iii. Olive Patrick;<sup>68,69</sup> born 17 Sep 1760;<sup>70,71,72</sup> married William Stallard, son of William Stallard and Mary Collins, 17 Aug 1787 at Buriton, Co. Hampshire, England; where William was from Catherington, and Olive from Buriton;<sup>73,71</sup> died "aged 74 years" 18 Oct 1834 at Buriton, Co. Hampshire, England, at age 74;<sup>74,75</sup> buried 23 Oct 1834 at St. Mary's Church, Buriton, Co. Hampshire, England.<sup>76,77</sup>

She was a publican in 1830 at Five Bells public house, Buriton, Co. Hampshire, England.<sup>78</sup>

- iv. Frances Patrick; christened 17 Apr 1762;<sup>59</sup> married William Welch 11 Jul 1786 at St. Mary's Church, Buriton, Co. Hampshire, England;<sup>39</sup> died 1 Feb 1836 at Buriton, Co. Hampshire, England, at age 73.<sup>79</sup>

Frances and William had four children: Richard (1788-1853), William (1786-1835), Frances (b.1790), Mary (b.1793). Wife of a Welch descendant, Liz Wakelin shared much of her Patrick research in 1998.<sup>30</sup>

- v. Richard Patrick; christened 20 Jan 1765;<sup>59</sup> married Ann Pratt 18 Sep 1798 at St. Mary's, Portsea, Co. Hampshire, England;<sup>80</sup> died 1848;<sup>81</sup> buried 2 Feb 1848 at Buriton, Co. Hampshire, England.<sup>81</sup>

He appeared on the census of 1841 at Buriton, Co. Hampshire, England; where Richard (75) a bricklayer and Ann (65) were present in the same home as their son Thomas, and the Spooner, Pretty, and Sheet families.<sup>82,83</sup> In 1841, Richard paid tithes on his residence on North Lane, Buriton, a cottage and garden.<sup>84</sup>

**11.** Elizabeth<sup>7</sup> PATRICK;<sup>49,49</sup> baptized Feb 1707/8 at St. Mary's Church, Buriton, Co. Hampshire, England;<sup>49</sup> married John West 12 Dec 1731 at Petersfield, Co. Hampshire, England; where John was widower of Petersfield, and Elizabeth a spinster of Buriton.<sup>56,85</sup>

Children of Elizabeth<sup>7</sup> Patrick and John West were as follows:

**12.** Thomas<sup>7</sup> PATRICK of Lynch;<sup>49,49</sup> baptized 30 May 1710 at St. Mary's Church, Buriton, Co. Hampshire, England;<sup>49</sup> married Sarah (--?--).<sup>30</sup>

The brothers Thomas and William Patrick were living in Buriton in 1744.<sup>2</sup>

Sarah (--?--) may have died in 1768.<sup>86</sup> She was buried on 17 Aug 1768 at St. Mary's Church, Buriton, Co. Hampshire, England, "Mrs. Patrick of Lynch."<sup>86</sup>

Children of Thomas<sup>7</sup> Patrick of Lynch and Sarah (--?--) were as follows:

- i. Sarah<sup>8</sup> Patrick;<sup>49,49</sup> baptized 22 Oct 1734 at St. Mary's Church, Buriton, Co. Hampshire, England.<sup>49</sup>
- ii. Thomas Patrick;<sup>49,49</sup> baptized 30 Dec 1736 at St. Mary's Church, Buriton, Co. Hampshire, England.<sup>49</sup>
- iii. William Patrick<sup>87,87</sup> was living in 1750.<sup>87</sup>
- iv. John Patrick;<sup>30,30</sup> born circa 1741;<sup>30</sup> died 1741;<sup>47</sup> buried 16 Sep 1741 at St. Mary's Church, Buriton, Co. Hampshire, England, "of Thomas Patrick of Lynch."<sup>30,47</sup>
- v. Elizabeth Patrick;<sup>30,30</sup> born circa 1745;<sup>30</sup> died 1762;<sup>30</sup> buried 10 Aug 1762 at St. Mary's Church, Buriton, Co. Hampshire, England, "of Thomas Patrick of Lynch."<sup>47</sup>

**13.** William<sup>7</sup> PATRICK;<sup>49,49</sup> baptized 2 Sep 1712 at St. Mary's Church, Buriton, Co. Hampshire, England;<sup>49</sup> married Mary Heberdan 15 Nov 1742 at St. Mary's Church, Buriton, Co. Hampshire, England;<sup>30,52</sup> died Nov 1772 at Buriton, Co. Hampshire, England, at age 60;<sup>47</sup> buried 29 Nov 1772 at St. Mary's Church, Buriton, Co. Hampshire, England;<sup>47</sup> his estate was probated 17 Feb 1773 at Co. Hampshire, England.<sup>88</sup>

The brothers Thomas and William Patrick were living in Buriton in 1744.<sup>2</sup> He left a will on 7 Nov 1772 at Buriton, Co. Hampshire, England; where he wrote "I William Patrick the elder...bequeath unto my daughter Mary George wife of Joseph George of Shepton Mallett, Somerset, butcher."<sup>89</sup>

Mary HEBERDAN died in 1750.<sup>30</sup> She died in Jul 1750.<sup>30,90</sup> She was buried on 4 Jul 1750 at St. Mary's Church, Buriton, Co. Hampshire, England.<sup>91</sup>

Children of William<sup>7</sup> Patrick and Mary Heberdan all born at St. Mary's Church, Buriton, Co. Hampshire, England, were as follows:

- i. William<sup>8</sup> Patrick;<sup>92,92</sup> baptized 18 Jul 1745.<sup>92</sup>
- ii. Mary Patrick;<sup>92,92</sup> baptized 29 Sep 1747;<sup>92</sup> married Joseph George 9 Mar 1768 at St. Mary's Church, Buriton, Co. Hampshire, England.<sup>89,52</sup>
- iii. Thomas Patrick;<sup>92,92</sup> baptized 1 Jul 1750;<sup>92</sup> died Jul 1750;<sup>47</sup> buried 20 Aug 1750 at St. Mary's Church, Buriton, Co. Hampshire, England, "of Thomas and Mary Patrick."<sup>47</sup>

He emigrated in 1855 to Toronto, York Co., Canada West (Ontario), British North America (Canada); his "year of settlement."<sup>5</sup> He lived in 1857 at Mimico (Islington), York Co., Canada West (Ontario), British North America (Canada); where he was a blacksmith.<sup>6,7</sup> He and Charlotte Cave appeared on the census of 1861 at York Co., Canada West (Ontario), British North America (Canada); where Willis (58) was a blacksmith. Charlotte (59), Thomas (25) a carpenter, Sarah (24), Henry (23) a tinsmith were present. Also Willis' daughter Martha Tyer (27) and her daughter Jessie (4) were recorded.<sup>8</sup> He and Charlotte Cave appeared on the census of 1871 at York Co., Ontario, Canada; where Willis (68) a blacksmith, and Charlotte (69), Henry (29), Thomas (36) a carpenter, his wife Caroline (26) and daughter Amy (1) were present.<sup>9</sup>

Charlotte CAVE was possibly christened on 18 Aug 1811 at St. Mary's, Portsea, Co. Hampshire, England; daughter of Henry Cave and Elizabeth.<sup>10</sup> She died "blacksmith's widow, aged 75" on 13 Jun 1878 at Etobicoke Twp., York Co., Ontario, Canada, at age 66.<sup>3,11</sup> She was buried on 15 Jun 1878 at St. George's On-The-Hill, Islington, York Co., Ontario, Canada.<sup>3</sup>

Hampshire, England; where George was recorded to be a fellmonger living in Havant, and Charlotte was from Warblington;<sup>2,17</sup> died circa Feb 1881;<sup>18,19</sup> buried 22 Feb 1881 at St. Faith's, Havant, Co. Hampshire, England, "age 51."<sup>20</sup>

Charlotte Cave Ide's family was a focus of A.D. Bone's early research of the Islington relations: her sisters Martha (1833-1914) and Sarah Ann (1836-1907) married Tier brothers Thomas (1832-1923) and Robert (1838-1913); her brother Thomas Henry (1834-1907) married Caroline Judd (1845-1913), the niece of her own husband George Stallard. Several Tiers and Ides are buried at St. George's-on-the-Hill, Islington.<sup>21</sup> She and George Stallard emigrated circa 1856 to Canada West (Ontario), British North America (Canada).<sup>22</sup> She and George Stallard appeared on the census of 1861 at South Street, Havant, Co. Hampshire, England; where George (32) was a parchment manufacturer employing 9 men and 4 boys, Charlotte C. (31), George (6), Clarissa C. (4), Thorburn (2), and Matilda (7 mos) were present.<sup>23,24</sup>

George STALLARD was christened on 3 Aug 1828 at Buriton, Co. Hampshire, England.<sup>25</sup> He died "aged 77" on 23 Jun 1906 at Havant, Co. Hampshire, England, at age 77.<sup>26,27</sup> He was a parchment maker and fellmonger between 1847 and 1856 at Homewell Parchment Yard, Havant, Co. Hampshire, England.<sup>28</sup> George and his family returned to England between 1857 and 1859.<sup>29</sup> He was a parchment maker between 1859 and 1906 at Homewell Parchment Yard, Havant, Co. Hampshire, England.<sup>30</sup> He was living in 1867 at East Street, Havant, Co. Hampshire, England; and was a parchment maker.<sup>31</sup> At sometime between their father's retirement, and subsequent death in 1869, George and Albert formed 'G. & A. Stallard' at Homewell.<sup>28</sup> He appeared on the census of 1881 at East Street, Havant, Co. Hampshire, England; where George (52) was a widower, a Fellmonger Master employing 19 Men 7 Boys. His children Thorburn (22) also a fellmonger, Matilda F. (20), Emma A. (18), Sidney (10) and servant Harriett Hiscole (19) were present.<sup>32</sup> George and Albert Stallard were parchment makers in Havant in 1900.<sup>33</sup> He appeared on the census of 1901 at Havant, Co. Hampshire, England; where George (72) was a parchment maker.<sup>34</sup> Upon George and Albert's retirement, G. & A. Stallard was run by George's son Thorburn until 1936.<sup>28</sup> In 1909, the employees of G. & A. Stallard were photographed at Homewell. Neither George nor Albert appear in the photo, but an E. Stallard does (smartly dressed, large white beard, appears 60-70 years old).<sup>28</sup>

Hampshire, England; where he was a fishmonger, aged 42.<sup>34</sup> It was said that Thorburn eventually ran the G. & A. Stallard parchment works at Homewell, until, as the last parchment yard in Havant, they closed in 1936. This must be false, as he died in 1923.<sup>28,45</sup>
